A game about gender and science

Play the GG! is a board game created by scientists (women and men) for children, youth and adults in order to raise awareness of gender differences in our society.

In order to deconstruct the gender stereotypes, it is necessary to interact with children, teenagers and adults and through discussions raise awareness of the existence, creation and impact of gender stereotypes on the relations between women and men in society.

The main goal of the game is to make people want to question preconceived ideas, to construct an argument and to become familiar with scientific reasoning.

This game can be played at school, at maisons relais, at maisons des jeunes, at clubs, or at work during training activities.

How to play?

Choose a figure – roll the dice – pick a card – answer a question about gender stereotypes – does your answer match scientific findings?

Reunite players around a giant board game (3X3m). Play individually or with teams.

The players navigate through 4 areas of gender inequalities: knowledge, work, power, society. The first player to get 4 questions correct (one in each areas of gender inequalities) wins!
